NEW STUDENT ORIENTATION CHECK-IN

Pick up your Orientation materials in **Edens Library on Friday, August 23 from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.** Parking is available in Lots D, E, & F. Map Link: <https://tinyurl.com/cccampusmap>

Check-in provides a centralized place for you and your parents to meet with representatives from the offices of Admissions, Tuition Accounts, Financial Aid, and Residence Life & Housing. All students must complete the check-in process during this appointed time in order to confirm their class schedules.

Attendance counts towards your LA 100 grade and is mandatory at all Orientation sessions on Friday, August 23 through Monday, August 26.

Resident Students:

You must report to Edens Library to check in before you can move into McNair Hall. You will receive your residence hall room key only after you have completed the check-in process. We recommend you label all of your items with your name and room number.
