

## **A tenure track position in Exercise Science and Community and Public Health at Columbia College**

Columbia College is seeking applicants for a tenure-track position at the rank of Assistant Professor of Exercise Science and Public Health beginning August 15, 2018. Responsibilities for this position will include teaching in both the exercise science and community and public health programs and assuming the role of program coordinator for both programs. Thus, candidates should demonstrate a strong commitment to teaching excellence, a potential to sustain a program of productive scholarship, and a desire to work in a liberal arts environment with emphasis on leadership development.

The successful candidate for this exercise science/public health position must have a Ph.D. in public health, exercise science or a related field with credentials to teach in both public health and exercise science by the time of appointment.

To apply, a candidate must submit the following materials: a cover letter describing their teaching and research interests and experiences, an up-to date curriculum vitae, a teaching statement that includes one's teaching philosophy and methodology, a statement about one's research and other scholarly endeavors, at least three letters of recommendation (one of which addresses teaching), and copies of graduate transcripts. Unofficial copies of transcripts will suffice for the initial application stage. In addition, applicants must complete a Columbia College job application, and, for Federal and State reporting purposes only, the Affirmative Action form attached to the application form.
