Find the free app on Apple App Store or Google Play. Log in with your Columbia College username and password (same as email), and you'll take a brief survey before getting your Summer Orientation Checklist.

#### ✓ Access Your Email

Check your email frequently, so you don't miss important information throughout the summer. Set up your email.

#### ✓ Download the Canvas App

#### To Reset KC Password

-In KC logon screen, enter **<u>Student ID</u>** in the Username Field and then click on 'Forgot Password'. Enter your CC email on the next screen. An email (from jicsinfo@columbiasc.edu) will be sent to your CC email with a link to reset your password.

-Logon to your CC email and open the email. Click on "click here to reset password". Reset to Koala+the last 4 digits of your SSN.

## **FINANCIAL AID TIPS**

The Office of Financial Aid awards aid to qualified applicants regardless of race, religious creed, place of national origin, ethnic group, or physical disability. Most aid is awarded on a first-come, first-serve basis so submit forms as soon as possible.

#### **COMPLETE THE FASFA**

File the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) online. Keep in mind that all South Carolina residents must complete the FAFSA <u>no later</u> <u>than June 30th</u> to qualify for the South Carolina Tuition Grant.

#### **REQUIREMENTS TO MAINTAIN AWARDS**

- Must have a cumulative GPA of 2.0
- Must pass 67% of all attempted hours Graduate Students
- Must have a cumulative GPA of 3.0
- Must pass 67% of all attempted hours

### The Office of Career & Student Success: Accessibility Services

Columbia College is committed to providing educational opportunities for all students and assisting them in making their college experience successful and positive. In compliance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, Columbia College recognizes a student with a disability as anyone who has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activity. Columbia College coordinates the provision of reasonable accommodations for students with disabilities.

The mission of the Accessibility Services Office at Columbia College is to create an academically, socially and physically accessible environment for students with disabilities by removing obstacles to learning.

#### ACCOMMODATION PROCESS

Each request for accommodations is considered on a case -by-case basis. To request accommodations, students must complete an application, provide documentation and schedule a collaborative consultation. Some accommodations require significant pre-planning, so students should begin the application process well in advance of the start of their first academic semester.

#### **AVAILABLE SERVICES**

Services may include (but are not limited to):

- Academic accommodations
- Testing accommodations
- Accessible housing
- Use of assistive devices
- Resource information and referral

#### DOCUMENTATION

Current documentation from a qualified physician or other licensed professional in a field related to the disability or medical condition is required. Since each disability is unique, guidelines for what constitutes appropriate documentation for a particular disability are available. At a minimum, the documentation must address:

- Verification of disability/statement of diagnosis
- Substantial functional limitations noted as a result of the disability on a major life activity (e.g., learning, hearing, seeing)
- Recommendations of possible accommodations





#### **Course Reserves**

Your professor may put items for you to read or view on Reserve in Edens Library. Reserve materials are located at the Circulation Desk and arranged by the professor's name. You must check out items from Reserves, so be sure to have your CC ID with you.

#### **Checking Out Books...and Other Items**

Books are checked out for three weeks, and Media items (such as CDs and DVDs) are checked out for one week. Checkedout items can be renewed. Your student ID is your library card, so be sure to have it with you when you want to check out items from the library. You can also renew items over the phone. The library offers approximately 400,000 e-books. If you find that we do not have a book you want, see if another academic library in SC does, and complete a **PASCAL Deliv-**
